**GOSPEL READING: Luke 4:1-13**

Luke's account of the temptations follows right after the genealogy, which concludes "son of Adam, son of God." Adam, who was also God's son and was tempted in the garden, failed the test. Jesus, the son of God, was tempted in the wilderness, and passed the test. This sets up an interesting parallel between two contrasting ways of responding to "divine provenance."

1. How do the three temptations connect with the three ways the church invites us to observe Lent: fasting, almsgiving and prayer?
2. How do the temptations Jesus faced manifest themselves in our world today?
3. Which of these temptations plague you the most?
