GOSPEL REFLECTION: JOHN 21:1-19

John wants to communicate one main message: "He is alive!" Instead of chiding the disciples for having returned to their former professions out of a sense of defeat, Jesus appears to them and joins them. Jesus' threefold questioning of Peter mirrors Peter's threefold denial, with Jesus initiating the forgiveness.

1. What is the mood of the disciples at the beginning of this passage, what happens after they see Christ?
2. How does this text suggest a new beginning for the disciples? For the world itself?
3. What picture of Peter begins to emerge from this text, does he foresee the task ahead of him?

- May 19: Bishop Mark Hagemoen will speak on the progress of the Catholic TRC Healing Response, and will provide information regarding the regional committee and their role in determining how the funds will be distributed. At the May 19 Bishop's Breakfast, participants will have an opportunity to ask questions and learn more about local reconciliation.
